- Prior involvement with criminal justice system
- Only received income in last 3-4 months of life; had been employed until kidney disease advanced; was denied SSI multiple times
- Able to pass in home with hospice care
- Very limited family supports
- Member of LGBTQ community
- No family supports to make funeral arrangements




The Area Deprivation Index— A Metric for Social Risk

Neighborhood Atlas, University of Wisconsin



Combines 17 metrics on housing quality, employment, poverty and education.

Measured at the level of census block groups→ roughly 1500 persons. Close to neighborhood level





Increase in Percent Homeless at Some Point in the Past 2 Years



The Lifespan Impacts of Homelessness

- 452 homeless individuals over age 50 were followed for 8 years
- 117 individuals died during the follow-up window
- Mortality rate was 3.5X the general population, and higher for women in this study (5.2X)
- The main causes of death were heart disease, cancer and drug overdose
- First episode of homelessness at age 50 or older was an independent predictor of early mortality.





Died early Spring 2022


Age: 66

- Received minimal SSI/SSDI income.


The Rising Age of Individuals Experiencing Homelessness

Homelessness as a Predictor of Cardiovascular Mortality

- 2 -3 X Increase in cardiovascular mortality in persons who report being homeless.
- Many convergent factors:
 - Decrease diagnosis and control of high blood pressure
 - Decrease control of diabetes
 - Increase incidence of tobacco use
 - Increase rates of HIV and HIV-associated CV disease
 - Higher rates of illegal drug use disorder, associated with CV mortality
 - Higher rates of allostatic load due to chronic stress, causing more CV disease
 - Higher rates of exposure to physical and sexual violence
 - Roughly ¼ have chronic serious mental illness (schizophrenia, bipolar disorder or severe depression)
- As many as ½ of homeless persons do not have access to regular health care
- Care plan to reduce these disparities has to be tailored to the above barriers and coinciding health problems

- Very limited SSI income
 - Was evicted and rehoused
 - Limited social relationships

Homeless & Diabetes

- Macrovascular complications = MI, Stroke,
 Limb ischemia or heart failure
- Hospitalizations for glycemic complications includes DKA and severe hyperglycemia
- Rate of extremity amputations was 2.3 X higher in those experiencing homelessness
- Revascularizations Procedures = stenting & bypass surgeries

Compared to nonhomeless cohort, cohort with history of homelessness had:



Macrovascular Complications RR=1.85; 95%Cl:1.64-2.07



Hospitalization for Glycemic Complications RR=5.64: 95%CI: 4.07-7.81




Revascularization Procedures RR=0.76; 95%CI: 0.62-0.94 RR. rate ratio.




Skin/Soft Tissue Infections RR=3.78; 95%CI; 3.31-4.32

Mental Health Disparities experienced by Homeless Persons




By Persons Experiencing Homelessness, 2022 & 2023

Hospital Course for Those Experiencing Homelessness




Intersection of Traumatic Brain Injury & Homelessness




Overdose ED Visit Rates, SAW & Virginia


VDH, 2022 data, overdose visits/month/100K



Local & Virginia Hepatitis C Rates


VDH, 2020 data, cases/100K

Age: 57


- Experienced homelessness for at least 2 years prior to move-in, that we know about.
- Incredible interagency teamwork between street outreach, AH mobile clinic, AH community outreach, AH case management, VDH CHW, rapid rehousing.
- Does not have income (in process)
- Has needed surgical procedure for several years but was unable to receive without a place to recover.
- In prepping for the procedure, additional health concerns have been uncovered that require treatment.
